Course Outcome:

(a) Competencies: The undergraduate student must demonstrate:

1. Understanding of the principles of diagnosis of diseases of the skin, hair, nail and mucosa
2. Ability to recognise, diagnose, order appropriate investigations and treat common diseases of the skin including leprosy in the primary care setting and refer as appropriate
3. A syndromic approach to the recognition, diagnosis, prevention, counselling, testing and management of common sexually transmitted diseases including HIV based on national health priorities
4. Ability to recognise and treat emergencies including drug reactions and refer as appropriate.

(b) Integration: The teaching should be aligned and integrated horizontally and vertically in order to emphasise the biologic basis of diseases of the skin, sexually transmitted diseases and leprosy and to provide an understanding that skin diseases may be a manifestation of systemic disease.
