Learning Outcome and Graduate Attributes

Sree Gokulam Medical College follows competency based undergraduate curriculum (CBME) as per the guidelines provided by the affiliated Kerala University of Health Sciences and the regulatory body, the National Medical Commission. This new curriculum is an outcome based strategy where cognitive, psychomotor, affective and communication domains form its framework. Implementation of CBME has resulted in using learner-centric, team-based, interactive and experiential learning activities that focus on deeper understanding of the concepts. Formative assessments help in 'assessment for learning' than 'assessment of learning' and measure the performance outcome of students in these domains.

Outcome based curriculum (OBE) emphasises on defining the outcomes the students are expected to achieve at the end of the program, assess if the students have achieved them and modify teaching-learning methods to enable the process through continuous review and quality improvement.

Quality assurance requires evaluation of the program. This can be achieved objectively by clearly defining the program outcome, course outcome and analysis of their attainment. Since such practices are not a common place for the health care institutions in India, guidelines prescribed by NBA and those followed by some medical colleges are referred. Combination of CBME and OBE has resulted in improvement in the quality of education through refined delivery of the curriculum, upgradation of resources and focussed assessments.

Goal of the Undergraduate Training Program (as specified by MCI / NMC):

To create an 'Indian Medical Graduate' (IMG) possessing requisite knowledge, skills, attitudes, values and responsiveness, so that he/she may function appropriately and effectively as a physician of first contact of the community while being globally relevant.
