**Sub.:-Recognition/approval of Sree Gokulam Medical College and Research Foundation, Trivandrum for the award of MBBS degree granted by Kerala University of Health Sciences, Thrissur against the increased intake i.e. from 50 to 150 seats u/s 11(2) of the IMC Act, 1956-Regarding.**

Sir,

I am directed to inform you that an assessment to verify the compliance submitted by the college authorities on the deficiencies pointed out in the assessment report (02.06.2016 & 03.06.2016) with regard to recognition/approval of Sree Gokulam Medical College & Research Foundation, Trivandrum for the award of MBBS degree granted by Kerala University of Health & Allied Sciences, Thrissur against the increased intake i.e. from 50 to 150 seats u/s 11(2) of the IMC Act, 1956 was carried out by the Council assessors on 10.02.2017. The compliance verification assessment report (10.02.2017) alongwith previous assessment report (02.06.2016 & 03.06.2016) was considered by the Executive Committee of the Council at its meeting held on 21.03.2017. The following recommendations of the Executive Committee was approved by the General Body of the Council at its meeting held on 29<sup>th</sup> March, 2017:-

*"The Executive Committee of the Council considered the Council Assessors report (4<sup>th</sup> & 5<sup>th</sup> November, 2015) alongwith representation dated 16/11/2015 of the Principal, Sree Gokulam Medical College & Research Foundation, Thiruvananthapuram and noted the following:-*

1. Deficiency of faculty is 7.85 % as detailed in report.
2. Shortage of Residents is 17.85 % as detailed in the report.
3. Bed occupancy is 70 % on day of assessment.
4. There is no proper system of collection of samples from OPD & Indoor patients; Separate records are not shown.
5. No emergency operation was performed from 04/11/2015 till 11 a.m. on 05/11/2015.
6. Blood Bank: There is no separate record of blood & blood products dispensed in the institute.
7. Central Library: Details about Residents' reading room are not provided.
8. Residents' Hostel: There was no designated hostel for Residents. During verification, room allotment list of Senior Residents was not provided to assessors for cross checking.
9. Physiology department: In Clinical Physiology laboratory, work stations available are 34 which is inadequate.
10. RHTC: MSW does not have required qualification.
11. Central Registration was unable to show department wise past data of OPD & Indoor patients. Individual OPD departments are not maintaining proper records.
12. Residents are given salary & not stipend.
13. Other deficiencies as pointed out in the assessment report.



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In view of above, the Executive Committee of the Council decided to recommend to the Central Govt. not to renew the permission for admission of 6<sup>th</sup> batch of MBBS students against the increased intake i.e. from 50 to 150 u/s 10A of the IMC Act, 1956 in respect of Sree Gokulam Medical Colloge & Research Foundation, Trivandrum under Kerala University of Health & Allied Sciences, Thrissur for the academic year 2016-17."

The above decision of the Executive Committee was communicated to the Central Govt. vide Council letter dated 03.12.2015 and copy marked to the Colloge authorities with the request to submit the detailed point wise compliance.

In reference to above, the Principal, Sree Gokulam Medical Colloge & Research Foundation, Trivandrum had submitted the detailed compliance which was verified by the Council assessors by way of compliance verification assessment on 17.03.2016. The compliance verification assessment report (17.03.2016) alongwith previous assessment report (4<sup>th</sup> & 5<sup>th</sup> November, 2015) was considered by the Executive Committee at its meeting hold on 13.05.2016 and it was decided as under:-

"The Executive Committee of the Council considered the compliance verification assessment report (17.03.2016) along with assessment report (4<sup>th</sup> & 5<sup>th</sup> November, 2015) as well as letter dated 22.03.2016 from the Principal of the colloge and noted the following -

1. On actual physical verification, it was found that bed occupancy was 54 % at 10 a.m on day of assessment. (i.e. 369 out of 680 beds)
2. No emergency operation was performed during the period of 24 hours from 11 a.m 16/02/2016 till 11 a.m. 17/02/2016.
3. Dean refused to sign the assessment report after reading the same
4. Other deficiencies as pointed out in the assessment report.

In view of the above, the Executive Committee of the Council decided to recommend to the Central Govt. not to renew the permission for admission of 6<sup>th</sup> Batch of MBBS students against the increased intake i.e. from 50-150 in respect of Sree Gokulam Medical College & Research Foundation, Trivandrum under Kerala University of Health & Allied Sciences, Thrissur u/s 10A of the IMC Act, 1956 for the academic year 2016-2017.

The Executive Committee of the Council further decided to apply clause 8(3)(1)(c) of Establishment of Medical Colloge Regulation (Amendment), 2010(Part II), dated 16<sup>th</sup> April, 2010 and amended on 18th March, 2016, which reads as under:-

8(3)(1).....

- (c) Colleges which are already recognized for award of MBBS degree and/or running postgraduate courses

If it is observed during any inspection/assessment of the institute that the deficiency of teaching faculty and/or Residents is more than 10% and/or bed occupancy is <70%, compliance of rectification of deficiency from such an institute will not be considered for issue of renewal of permission in that Academic year and further such an institute will not be considered for processing applications for postgraduate courses in that Academic year and will be issued show cause notices as to why the recommendation for withdrawal of recognition of the courses run by that institute should not be made for undergraduate and postgraduate courses which are recognized u/s 11(2) of the IMC Act, 1956 along with direction of stoppage of admissions in permitted postgraduate courses."





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In view of above, it was decided not to consider the Institute for processing applications for postgraduate courses in the current Academic year (2017-18) and to issue show cause notice as to why the recommendation for withdrawal of recognition of the courses run by that institute should not be made for undergraduate and postgraduate courses which are recognized u/s 11(2) of the IMC Act, 1956 alongwith direction of stoppage of admissions in permitted postgraduate courses."

The above decision of the Executive Committee was communicated to the Central Government vide Council letter dated 15.05.2016.

The Council vide another letter dated 15.05.2016 had issued the Show Cause Notice to the college authorities to explain as to why the Council should not proceed to recommend to the Central Govt. for withdrawal of recognition of MBBS degree/Postgraduate course of the institute and stoppage of admissions in permitted postgraduate course.

On the recommendations of the Council, the Central Govt. vide its letter 10.06.2016 had conveyed its decision to the College authorities as well as other concerned authorities Not to admit any students against increased intake from 50-150 in MBBS course for the academic year 2016-17.

Upon receipt of the request u/s 11(2) of the IMC Act, 1956 through the Central Govt., the assessments to assess the standard of examination held by Kerala University of Health Sciences, Thrissur and to assess the physical and the other teaching facilities available for recognition/approval of Sree Gokulam Medical College and Research Foundation, Trivandrum for the award of MBBS degree granted by Kerala University of Health Sciences, Thrissur against the increased intake i.e. from 50 to 150 seats u/s 11(2) of the IMC Act, 1956 were carried out by the Council assessors on 27.04.2016 and 02.06.2016 & 03.06.2016. The assessment reports were considered by the Executive Committee at its meeting held on 30.06.2016 and it was decided as under:-

"The Executive Committee of the Council considered the assessment reports (27.04.2016) & (02.06.2016 & 03.06.2016) and noted the following:-

1. Shortage of Residents is 19.54 % as detailed in the report.
2. Most of Senior Residents do not stay on the campus.
3. NIL patient was admitted in Casualty till 11:30 a.m. on day of assessment.
4. Wards: Ancillary facilities are not available as per MSR Regulations in several wards. Wards of General Medicine department do not have attached Demonstration rooms.
5. Other deficiencies as pointed out in the assessment report.

In view of above, the Executive Committee of the Council decided to recommend to the Central Government not to recognize/approve Sree Gokulam Medical College and Research Foundation, Trivandrum for the award of MBBS degree granted by Kerala University of Health Sciences, Thrissur against the increased intake i.e. from 50 to 150 seats u/s 11(2) of the IMC Act, 1956 and further decided that the institute be asked to submit the compliance for rectification of the above deficiencies within 01 month for further consideration of the matter.

The Committee further decided to continue the application of clause 8(3)(1)(c) of Establishment of Medical College Regulation (Amendment), 2010 (Part II) dated 16<sup>th</sup> April, 2010 and amended on 18.03.2016."





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The above decision of the Executive Committee was communicated to the Central Government vide Council letter dated 26.09.2016 and copy to marked to the College authorities with the request to submit the compliance within 1(one) month.

In the meantime, the Central Govt. vide its letter dated 26.09.2016 had granted approval to the said college for renewal of permission for admission of 6<sup>th</sup> batch of MBBS students against the increased intake i.e. from 50-150 for the academic year 2016-17, in the light of the directive of the Supreme Court Mandated Oversight Committee (OC), subject to submission of bank guarantees, affidavit and some other conditions.

In continuation to the earlier letter dated 26.09.2016, the Central Govt. vide its letter dated 28.09.2016 had forwarded the following the documents as submitted by the college to the Ministry on 27.09.2016:-

- An affidavit dated 27.09.2016 from the Chairman of the Trust/Society and the Dean /Principal of the College concerned
- A bank guarantee bearing No. IBG71538 dated 27.09.2016 Rs 2 Cr issued by Federal Bank of Ltd in favour of MCI, with a validity of 1 year.

In reference to the Council's letter dated 26.09.2016, the Principal, Sree Gokulam Medical College and Research Foundation, Trivandrum had submitted the detailed compliance which was verified by the Council assessors by way of compliance verification assessment on 10.02.2017 with reference to the conditional approval accorded by the Oversight Committee. The compliance verification assessment report 10.02.2017 along with previous assessment report (2<sup>nd</sup> & 3<sup>rd</sup> June, 2016) was considered by the Executive Committee at its meeting held on 21.03.2017 and it was decided as under:-

"The Executive Committee of the Council noted that the compliance verification assessment report )17.03.2016 (along with previous assessment report )4<sup>th</sup> & 5<sup>th</sup> November, 2015 (was considered by the Executive Committee at its meeting held on 13.05.2016 and it was decided as under:-

"The Executive Committee of the Council considered the compliance verification assessment report )17.03.2016 (along with assessment report )4<sup>th</sup> & 5<sup>th</sup> November, 2015 (as well as letter dated 22.03.2016 from the Principal of the college and noted the following:-

1. On actual physical verification, it was found that bed occupancy was 54 % at 10 a.m. on day of assessment. (i.e. 369 out of 680 beds).
2. No emergency operation was performed during the period of 24 hours from 11 a.m. 16/02/2016 till 11 a.m. 17/02/2016.
3. Dean refused to sign the assessment report after reading the same.
4. Other deficiencies as pointed out in the assessment report.

In view of the above, the Executive Committee of the Council decided to recommend to the Central Govt. not to renew the permission for admission of 6<sup>th</sup> Batch of MBBS students against the increased intake i.e. from 50-150 in respect of Sree Gokulam Medical College & Research Foundation, Trivandrum under Kerala University of Health & Allied Sciences, Thrissur u/s 10A of the IMC Act, 1956 for the academic year 2016-2017.

The Executive Committee of the Council further decided to apply clause 8(3)(1)(c) of Establishment of Medical College Regulation (Amendment), 2010 (Part II), dated 16<sup>th</sup> April, 2010 and amended on 18th March, 2016, which reads as under:-





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8(3)(1).....

(c) Colleges which are already recognized for award of MBBS degree and/or running postgraduate courses

*If it is observed during any inspection/assessment of the institute that the deficiency of teaching faculty and/or Residents is more than 10% and/or bed occupancy is <70%, compliance of rectification of deficiency from such an institute will not be considered for issue of renewal of permission in that Academic year and further such an institute will not be considered for processing applications for postgraduate courses in that Academic year and will be issued show cause notices as to why the recommendation for withdrawal of recognition of the courses run by that institute should not be made for undergraduate and postgraduate courses which are recognized u/s 11(2) of the IMC Act, 1956 along with direction of stoppage of admissions in permitted postgraduate courses."*

*In view of above, it was decided not to consider the Institute for processing applications for postgraduate courses in the current Academic year (2017-18) and to issue show cause notice as to why the recommendation for withdrawal of recognition of the courses run by that institute should not be made for undergraduate and postgraduate courses which are recognized u/s 11(2) of the IMC Act, 1956 alongwith direction of stoppage of admissions in permitted postgraduate courses."*

*The above decision of the Executive Committee was communicated to the Central Government vide Council letter dated 15.05.2016.*

*The Council vide another letter dated 15.05.2016 had issued the Show Cause Notice to the college authorities to explain as to why the Council should not proceed to recommend to the Central Govt .for withdrawal of recognition of MBBS degree/Postgraduate course of the institute and stoppage of admissions in permitted postgraduate course.*

*On the recommendations of the Council, the Central Govt .vide its letter 10.06.2016 had conveyed its decision to the College authorities as well as other concerned authorities not to admit any students against increased intake from 50-150 in MBBS course for the academic year 2016-17.*

*Thereafter the Central Govt .vide its letter dated 26.09.2016 had granted approval to the said college for renewal of permission for admission of 6<sup>th</sup> batch of MBBS students against the increased intake i.e .from 50<sup>1</sup>150 for the academic year 2016-17, in light of the directive dated 13.06.2016 of the Supreme Court Mandated Oversight Committee )OC(, subject to submission of bank guarantees, affidavit and some other conditions.*

*In continuation to the earlier letter dated 26.09.2016, the Central Govt .vide its letter dated 28.09.2016 had forwarded the following documents as submitted by the college to the Ministry on 27.09.2016:-*

- i. An affidavit dated 27.09.2016 from the Chairman of the Trust/Society and the Dean /Principal of the College concerned
  - ii. A bank guarantee bearing No. IBG71538 dated 27.09.2016 Rs 2 Cr issued by Federal Bank of Ltd in favour of MCI, with a validity of 1 year.
- In reference to the Council's letter dated 26.09.2016, the Principal, Sree Gokulam Medical College and Research Foundation, Trivandrum had submitted the detailed compliance which was verified by the Council assessors by way of compliance verification assessment on 10.02.2017.*



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The Executive Committee further noted that in reference to conditional approval granted by the Central Govt. in the light of directive/approval of the Oversight Committee, an assessment for verifying the conditions stipulated in the Letter of Permission dated 26.09.2016 for renewal of permission for admission of 6<sup>th</sup> batch of MBBS students against the increased intake i.e. from 50-150 for the academic year 2016-17 was carried out by the Council Assessors on 10.02.2017 and decided to recommend to the Central Govt. to revoke notice issued under clause 8(3)(1)(c) of Establishment of Medical College Regulation (Amendment), 2010 (Part II), dated 16<sup>th</sup> April, 2010 and amended on 18.03.2016 and further confirm the conditional Letter of Permission for renewal of permission for admission of 6<sup>th</sup> batch of MBBS students against the increased intake i.e. from 50-150 for the academic year 2016-17 in respect of Sree Gokulam Medical College & Research Foundation, Trivandrum under Kerala University of Health & Allied Sciences, Thrissur u/s 10A of the IMC Act, 1956 for the academic year 2016-2017.

The Executive Committee of the Council further decided to recommend to the Central Government for recognition/approval of Sree Gokulam Medical College and Research Foundation, Trivandrum for the award of MBBS degree granted by Kerala University of Health Sciences, Thrissur against the increased intake i.e. from 50 to 150 seats u/s 11(2) of the IMC Act, 1956.

The Executive Committee further decided that the attention of the institute be drawn to Sections 8(3)(2), 8(3)(3) & 8(3)(4) of the Establishment of Medical Colleges Regulations (Amendment), 2010 (Part II) dated 16<sup>th</sup> April 2010 and act accordingly at appropriate time, which reads as under:-

8 (3) ...

(2) The recognition so granted to an Undergraduate Course for award of MBBS degree shall be for a maximum period of 5 years, upon which it shall have to be renewed.

(3) The procedure for 'Renewal' of recognition shall be same as applicable for the award of recognition.

(4) Failure to seek timely renewal of recognition as required in sub-clause (a) supra shall invariably result in stoppage of admissions to the concerned Undergraduate Course of MBBS at the said institute....."

In view of above, you are requested to issue necessary notification at the earliest recognizing Sree Gokulam Medical College & Research Foundation, Trivandrum for the award of MBBS degree when granted on or after April, 2016 by Kerala University of Health & Allied Sciences, Thrissur against the increased intake i.e. from 50 to 150 seats.
